Rector's Letter

Dear Friends:

Over the years St. Paul's has offered a ministry of discernment to many considering ordained ministry in the Episcopal Church. As rector I have worked with these folks whose time at St. Paul's was a time of experiencing areas of ministry they may never have been involved in before, as well as developing and growing in areas with which they have some familiarity.

Being one of the largest parishes in the Diocese of North Carolina, we offer a vast variety of ministry opportunities as well as the experience of ministering in a large congregation, which almost all our interns find totally new. I thoroughly enjoy working with those who are discerning a vocation to ordained ministry and spending time with them reflecting on how God is moving in their lives through their internship at St. Paul's. I also have valued what I have learned from them. It's wonderful for me, who has been ordained 35 years, to see and hear the hopes and dreams of those discerning a call to the priesthood or the diaconate.

The impact St. Paul's has on these interns will follow them into their future ordained ministry. I like to say that a bit of St. Paul's goes forth with these future leaders as they go forth to congregations throughout the Episcopal Church. Many of them I still keep in touch with offering support and advice.

This summer offers St. Paul's a very unique opportunity. We will welcome an intern who is studying for the priesthood for the Church of England. Allen Waller is a seminarian studying at Wycliffe Hall at Oxford University in England. Allen will be ordained next year. As part of his formation all seminarians are required to complete an internship. Most fulfill that internship in England. Some elect to engage in an international internship. Allen contacted me last summer and Cathy Deats and I met with him to discuss the possibility of an international internship here at St. Paul's.

I am very excited about welcoming Allen. He will preach a couple times as well as participate in various forms of ministry with us. What a gift this will be for all of us.

Allen will join us the beginning of August and be with us through the middle of September. Please join me in welcoming Allen.

"St. Paul's is in the midst of exciting times as we move forward with renewed focus and purpose.

One of the most exciting things to happen has been establishing dedicated staff in key positions of leadership that we identified as priorities in the 2013 Visioning Process. These men and women - two associate rectors, a minister of music and youth program coordinator - have made a commitment to our church

community to join us on our faith journey and help us seek and live into God's call to us. It is a pleasure to welcome them!

But there is more to do for St. Paul's to fully live into the opportunity put before us - once again, the Vision we as a community set for ourselves - we must take deliberate steps to ensure we are able to meet our 2015 goals. We have a number of programs that require further financial support as we grow as a parish and live into our ministries.



Family Heritage at Easter Vigil



The Easter Vigil is one of the most important times in the Christian year for the celebration of Holy Baptism, and at St. Paul's Easter Vigil service on Saturday April 4th two baptisms took place. One was the baptism of 5-month-old Ember Bella Arnold, daughter of Adam and Jessica Arnold and granddaughter of Gordon and Alison Arnold. This was a special occasion for the Arnold family; Ember is her parents' first child and her grandparents' first grandchild. It was also a special occasion for Ember's English relatives, whom she has yet to meet. Ember's grandmother Alison traveled to her family home in England in March and returned to North Carolina with the christening dress Ember would wear for her baptism. The dress is almost 100

years old. Ember's father was baptized in the dress in England 30 years ago, and so too was Ember's grandmother, her great grandmother, and her great great grandmother before her. And before this, the dress had been made from the wedding veil of Ember's great, great, great grandmother around the year 1920. In her homily at St. Paul's that Easter Eve, the Rev. Dr. Cathy Deats told the congregation: "Everyone has a story... Ember Bella has a story... that started long before she was born." Ember's christening dress is the legacy of her family in England—her Church of England family—and through her baptism at St. Paul's Church, the dress is now part of Ember's story—her family in America, and her Episcopal family.

"Let us welcome the newly baptized."

CHH Update

What is going on at CHH? Does it still exist? What is CHH?

Those are among the questions floating around with regards to St. Paul's Center for Hope and Healing, the nonprofit counseling center located in the house we once called Epiphany House. You may recall the buzz as the community came together to convert the house into offices for counselors and group meeting space several years ago. So what's been happening since then?

CHH remains an independent 501(c)3 nonprofit business that supports persons from all backgrounds and beliefs. We have kept our vision, to improve the mental wellness of members of the community and encourage them to embrace the value of maintaining their mental well being along with their physical health. We have changed our business model slightly, recruiting established professionals with a common mission, to provide a new perspective on mental wellness in a comfortable, non-clinical environment.

Melissa Huemmer, LCSW, remains one of our contracted counselors. Melissa specializes in working with adolescents, young adults and their families around a variety of issues including depression, anxiety, learning disabilities, and social skills. Ruth Burnett, LPC, joined CHH this spring and expanded our counseling services, bringing 7 years of experience as an outpatient mental health therapist providing services for a wide range of ages and mental health issues. Nancy Titus continues to provide spiritual

direction services.

This summer we will welcome Rebecca Bush, a licensed educational psychologist who is relocating from California. Rebecca has a strong background in assessing, diagnosing, and treating children with educational disabilities. She describes her goal "to provide exceptional assessment, consultation, and other necessary supportive services to people having difficulty in the school setting."

Rounding out our summer additions will be Lezleigh Vincent, a wellness professional with an interest in the mindfulness connection to physical fitness. Lezleigh is a certified personal trainer, yoga instructor, and second degree Reiki practitioner with a calming, inspirational approach to regaining physical wellness.

With the addition of these new providers, you can expect to hear more about new programs in the coming months. We will be hosting several Mindfulness Based Stress Reduction courses for Duke Integrative Medicine, as well as special programs on parenting and dealing with grief. 

What a great way to kick off the school year.







Meet Yvonne Gharthey, Parishioner, & Dorcas Ministry volunteer

Yvonne has been a member of St. Paul's for 23 years. She is a volunteer for Meals-on-Wheels, the newcomer bread ministry, and the Migrant Ministry. After beating the odds and surviving a really bad type of cancer, Yvonne started as a volunteer at the Dorcas Thrift Shop where she has been a volunteer since 2003. Yvonne has served on the Dorcas Ministry Board of Directors, priced clothing, and is currently a runner. In this role she takes racks of priced clothing and hangs them in appropriate locations on the shop floor. Being a runner is more physically challenging than pricing because along with hanging

the clothes, a runner picks up clothes that fall on the floor, are left draped over racks, or left in dressing rooms. She also removes items that may have gotten to the floor by mistake (dirty or torn) and collects empty hangers as well as answering customer questions. Yvonne personalized Bishop Curry's challenge to "Go Deep, Go Speak, Go Do, Go Home." After running clothes, she is ready to go home and rest. Thank you Yvonne for your commitment to this ministry and praise to all for your survival.


