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Rector's Letter

Dear Friends,

Thanksgiving is just a few weeks away. What a wonderful holiday. It is a feast, a celebration, that simply focuses on gathering together with others, to share a meal, remembering that unique meal that occurred many years ago, when folks of different cultures, traditions, and languages came together for that first Thanksgiving meal.

My family will be gathering together for Thanksgiving at Cape Cod, MA. A little known fact is that the Pilgrims, before landing and settling in Plymouth, landed at Provincetown, at the tip of Cape Cod. While exploring for food, they landed on a beach in Eastham and had their first encounter with the native people of the area. We'll be stopping by that beach during Thanksgiving to commemorate that first encounter.

November will be filled with other opportunities to give thanks. On November 5, St. Paul's will have its Annual Meeting and give thanks for this great faith community. We'll have the opportunity to elect 4 new vestry members and give thanks for the outgoing members, as well as highlight some areas of parish life for which we are thankful.

On November 9, I'm looking forward to joining with a few hundred folks from the community for a breakfast at Prestonwood Country Club giving thanks for the tremendous outreach work of Dorcas Ministries. St. Paul's has a long history of support and involvement with Dorcas, and many parishioners of St. Paul's are engaged in a variety of roles at Dorcas.

On November 17-18 along with the clergy and lay delegates of our parish, I will join with nearly 500 clergy and lay delegates from all the congregations of our diocese for the Annual Convention of the Diocese of North Carolina. Another opportunity to be thankful for our diocese and the ways our annual outreach gift to the diocese of \$119,656 makes a difference not only in our diocese, but the wider world.

And by November 12, we are all invited to give thanks for the gifts with which God has blessed each and every one of us, by making our financial pledge to St. Paul's, to support the clergy, staff, programs, and outreach of our parish in 2018. By "Sharing God's Blessings" you can make a difference to support the parish operating budget that needs to grow by 10% in order to support the growing demands of our parish.

Most importantly, I want to thank you for being a part of the life and ministry of St. Paul's.




About Our Church




we thought this was a timely choice. Come join us for our discussion.

We have checked with Pei Wei, Cary Town Center, and they are fine with us meeting there and holding our book club. No purchases required.


We will try it for the month of November, and if it doesn't work we can discuss alternatives.

This year, we filled more than 200 volunteer positions, which helped us to achieve overwhelmingly happy guests, who purchased almost 1,600 lobsters and 1,200 lobster rolls. Our gross sales exceeded \$53,000, and our net proceeds more than \$19,000, which will go to fund outreach and youth activities, and St. Paul's special projects.




Memorial Garden Workday

The Busy Bees and 2’s classes enjoyed their first chapel with Ms. Laura. They sang songs and listened to the story What Does God Look Like?





Advent Adult Formation Series: Approaching the Holy – What Do We Do in Worship?

Advent is a season of preparation in the church, a time when we ready our hearts and minds for the incarnation, the coming of Jesus Christ into human reality. In that spirit of preparation and expectation, join us on Sunday mornings as we continue exploring our Episcopal tradition: what do the various elements of our worship – the worship space, the reading of Scripture, and sharing bread and wine – indicate about the God whom we worship? What do these elements say about us and our faith in Jesus, who took on human flesh and lived among us? The Sunday forum will address these and related questions as we explore the mystery of the incarnation (Dec 3, 10, and 17 from 10:15-11:00 a.m.).

In seasons of preparation in the church, it is customary not simply to fast from things which may distract us, but also to take up practices which will help us focus on the meaning behind our worship and prayers. On Wednesday evenings in Advent (7:00-8:00 p.m.), I invite you to delve deeper into our Sunday readings alongside other members of St Paul's. We will hold our first "Eucharist and Conversation" series – an opportunity to slow down with the Scriptures in a more informal, meditative worship setting. Stay tuned for more information.





Heifer sends livestock and training to families in need around the world, to provide them with sustainable agriculture, food, and reliable income. St. Paul's provides the opportunity to donate to Heifer International every Sunday during morning services, in celebration of special people, times, and events in our lives. Christmas presents a special opportunity to honor those we know and love by giving alternative holiday gifts – Heifer donations – “outside the gift-wrapped box.”

You can place your donations in the Heifer Ark during the offertory on Sunday mornings. Checks should be made out to “St. Paul's Episcopal Church” with “Heifer International” written on the memo line. For each \$10 you donate, you can pick up a Heifer greeting card in the church narthex and mail it to the family member or friend you wish to honor this Christmas. St. Nicholas is coming to St. Paul's

St. Nicholas is coming! Look for the St. Nicholas and the Advent tree in the narthex, starting November 19th. **St. Nicholas Sunday is Dec. 10th.**

The tree will display tags—each with information and a wish list for an individual child. We bundled together some of the tags again this year to offer an opportunity for parishioners to provide gifts for a family. Each bundle represents a group of siblings. These bundled tags will be in envelopes held by the St. Nicholas figure standing on the counter by the tree. If you are inclined to make purchases for multiple children, please look for these bundled tags.

December 10th is the day to bring your gifts and present them to St. Nicholas! If you are unable to attend services on this day, please deliver your gifts to the office BEFORE then so they will reach these wonderful children on time. Presents received after noon on December 10th will not get to the child this year (but they will be saved and will be used for a child next year). Remember, each child should receive one box or bag (containing as many gifts as you wish) with the sticker label securely attached and easily visible. If purchasing a larger gift (like a bike), please photocopy the tag, clearly label the tags 1 of 2, and 2 of 2, etc., and securely attach the second tag to the oversized item.

We have about 400 names and gift ideas from four agencies that serve children and families in our community: CommWell Health in Newton Grove, West Haven Housing Ministry, Healing Transitions, and Families Together.

■ The St. Nicholas ministry began in the early 1980s to provide Christmas presents for the children at an Episcopal - sponsored orphanage located in Charlotte, NC. Back then, they gave us the names of the children with a wish list for each child. We published the list, and people brought gifts...lots of gifts. It was clear that St. Paul's could serve another agency.

■ St. Paul's was actively involved in our Diocese's nascent Episcopal Farmworker Ministry (EFwM), providing clothing and support services weekly to migrant farm workers through the Tri-County Health Center in Newton Grove. The Advent Tree was created to accommodate the larger number of names added by the children of the seasonal farm workers. Since then Tri-County has expanded its services and changed its name to CommWell Health, but it is still a community-governed and community- owned organization that provides health care to seasonal farm workers in Eastern NC. We continue to get many children's names from CommWell Health.

■ In 2001, we added children from the Episcopal Housing Ministry (EHM) (now known as West Haven Housing Ministry). EHM was a St. Paul's- and Diocesan-sponsored initiative to provide low-income, safe, housing for the working poor in Wake County. It has now been turned over to a private agent, West Haven, to manage.

■ The next year, we included children identified by Healing Transitions (formerly, The Healing Place) in Raleigh. These gifts go to the children of clients recovering from substance abuse. Healing Transitions asks us not to wrap the presents we provide since they want their recovering clients to wrap the gifts for their children themselves. This way, each client knows what he/she is giving.

■ Families Together (added in 2010) provides housing and job-counseling for the homeless in Cary and Wake County.

Contributions to the thrift shop and food pantry can be dropped off Monday-Friday from 8 am to 6pm; Saturday 8 am to 4 pm; or Sunday from 11 am to 2 pm. All donations are eligible for a tax receipt during business hours.



St. Paul's Choir Needs Altos and Basses






