## Rector's Letter

Dear Friends:

Just a couple weeks ago I gathered with newcomers to St. Paul's during our regularly scheduled Newcomer Classes. Thank you to Frank and Anne Laney who provide leadership of this ministry of welcome, as well as thank you to the numerous parishioners who bring loaves of bread to those visiting us for the first time and to those who provide welcome at the "red table" during coffee hour.

As rector, I find my participation at these newcomer classes to be one of the most rewarding aspects of my ministry. It is such a joy to welcome the numerous folks who come to St. Paul's and to listen to what drew them here. What is encouraging is the wide range of newcomers we welcome from varying ages, backgrounds, and demographics. Hearing one another's stories, and the sharing of my own, makes for a wonderful opportunity of coming to know one another. It is a reminder that amidst all we do here at St. Paul's the importance of building relationships is so significant.

During the summer months it can appear that there is less going on at St. Paul's than during the rest of the year. While some programs slow down many are very active but may not be as noticeable. And there are some ministries that actually are most active in the summer, like Appalachian Service Project, Vacation Bible School, Preschool Summer Camp, as well as some new Sunday opportunities that our Children's Ministry is initiating this summer.

But the most significant thing we are about happens throughout the summer and that is gathering at the altar each Sunday deepening our relationship with God and one another so that we can enter into relationship with those beyond our doors. This never takes a vacation but is an essential part of our vocation of following Christ, or what Bishop Curry calls "The Jesus Movement."

Looking forward to continuing the journey we walk together throughout the summer. See you on Sunday. I'll be there.


**Lanny Wase:** One of St. Paul's tireless volunteers who works behind the




## Remember When?
