St. Paul's Statement of Optimism



Warden's Corner

This month I was privileged to attend a "warden's retreat" of the Diocese of North Carolina. The retreat is an annual, one-day gathering where wardens (and other vestry members) are invited to get together to discuss their parishes. It was encouraging this year to hear Bishop Curry address us about the "possible" as well as the "probable". For example, in the vastness of interstellar space, it is probable that conditions for life would never exist, and yet they do — through God all things are "possible."

All of the wardens I spoke with were concerned about matters touching on the financial: how to maintain their outreach efforts, how to get or pay mortgages, how to attract and retain newcomers. However, in contrast to some years, there was an overall feeling of "realistic" optimism. Reflecting on Bishop Curry's message of the "possible," the vestry approved a Statement of Optimism on March 16, 2009 as a way of expressing St. Paul's hope for the future.

"It is vital for us, although challenged by uncertain economic times, to remain optimistic about the future and open to making real differences in the lives of those around us. We can do this through being open to what is possible, not just probable. We can take emotional and spiritual support from the wonderful gift of families and friends, our church community and the beauty and promise of God's world. We can focus on what we truly need and what sustains us in troubling times, and we can reach out with our gifts to change the world."

Have you introduced yourself to someone new this month? There's no easier way to focus on the possible and to say "All are Welcome."


Women Welcoming Women (WWW)

It is a "hands-on" ministry that allows adults and children to participate in packaging meals for the hungry. It is a great way to teach kids about outreach, and is great fun and an enriching experience for all. However, there is a substantial cost in the purchasing of food and materials for the meal packaging events. In past events, participants have been asked to make donations to cover the meals they pack. This may have placed a financial burden on some parishioners, especially families with children.

Collections from our Easter loose-plate offering will be used to help offset participation fees for the next Stop Hunger Now event. This is good news for folks who want to take part in this wonderful ministry

without having to endure the financial stress.

The Story of Miracle League Baseball

In 1997, in Rockdale County, Georgia, there were two brothers who loved baseball. One of them was 5 years old and played on a county baseball team. The other brother was 7 years old and was confined to a wheelchair. He could only watch.

But one day, a coach invited the older brother to participate on the little brother's team. The 7 year old came to every single practice and every single game. From his wheelchair, he cheered on his little brother and every player on the team—his team.

In 1998, the Rockdale County Youth Baseball Association formed the Miracle League to allow children with special needs to play baseball themselves. Special rubberized fields were used, and volunteer "buddies" helped the children at bat and safely round the bases. The first Miracle League started with 4 teams, and has grown to include more than 200 leagues across the country in which over 80,000 children participate. One of the rubberized fields used for the Miracle League is right here in Cary and there are 18 teams that play there.

Seeing the remarkable hardships these children face and overcome every minute of every day is very inspiring. Seeing the utter joy they experience when they play baseball is simply amazing. The Miracle League was started to bring joy to the children, but it is the children who bring joy to everyone who sees them.

St. Paul's will provide volunteer "buddies" for Miracle League players on Friday night, April 24, from 5:30 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. at Adams Elementary School. Please come out and enjoy a great night of fellowship, baseball and miracles!
