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Rector's Letter

Dear Friends:

Thank you all for your prayers, thoughts, cards and words of support and kindness at the passing of my mom, Margaret (Peg) Hinchcliffe Adamik. This has been a very emotional time for me and my family. I particularly want to thank the clergy, staff, and vestry for providing me the time and space needed during the last couple of months. I wish you could have all known my mom. Besides being an incredible mother she was the most grounded person I have known and has had a tremendous impact on my life. Please keep my father in your prayers as well he heals from a broken heart. My mom and dad would have been married 66 years May 1. They both showed me what love looks like.

We now walk through the Easter Season. In the Christian tradition, Easter is not just a day, but a 50 day season culminating with Pentecost Sunday. As the 40 day season of Lent was a time of preparation for renewal of our Baptismal promises on Easter Day, the 50 day season of Easter is a time to engage our lives with the world and bring about new life.

One way we will engage in bringing about this new life as a parish is through our outreach to the Migrant Ministry in Newton Grove, NC. Joining with every other Episcopal Parish from Charlotte to the coast, Harvest for Hospitality will be an opportunity to support and strengthen this outstanding Episcopal ministry. There is more information in this newsletter about the specifics of this effort.

The following is a reflection from Richard Rohr which I offer to you during this Easter Season:

“Christ Crucified is all of the hidden, private, tragic pain of history made public and given over to God. Christ Resurrected is all of that private, ungrieved, unnoted suffering received, loved, and transformed by an All-Caring God. How else could we believe in God at all? How else could we have any kind of cosmic hope? How else would we not die of sadness for what humanity has done to itself and to one another? Jesus is the blueprint, the plan, the pattern revealed in one body and moment of history to reveal the meaning of all of history and each of our lives. The cross is the banner of what we do to one another and to God. The resurrection is the banner of what God does to us in return. Easter is the announcement of God's perfect and final victory.”

Bishop Anne Hodges-Copple to Visit St. Paul's for Confirmation Services on April 26th

The Right Reverend Anne Elliott Hodges-Copple, VI Bishop Suffragan of North Carolina, will come to St. Paul's on April 26th to preside at the 9:00 a.m. and the 11:15 a.m. services. She will confirm new members, receive those who wish to transfer to St. Paul's, and reaffirm those who wish to renew their baptismal vows.



Anne Hodges-Copple was elected sixth Bishop Suffragan and the first female bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina on January 26, 2013, at the 197th Annual Convention. She was consecrated on June 15, 2013, in Duke Chapel on the

campus of Duke University in Durham, N.C.

Born in Texas, Bishop Hodges-Copple attended high school in Dallas before moving to Durham, N.C., for her undergraduate study. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Duke University in 1979. After working as a community organizer for several years following graduation, she earned her


Master of Divinity from Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, Calif., in 1984.

Bishop Hodges-Copple and her husband, John Hodges-Copple, moved back to N.C. in 1984, where she began working in the field of domestic violence prevention. Hodges-Copple was ordained to the priesthood in 1988 and served as assistant to the rector at St. Luke's, Durham, until 1992. She left St. Luke's to serve as Episcopal chaplain to Duke University until 2005, when she returned to St. Luke's as rector until her election as Bishop Suffragan in 2013.

In her role as Bishop Suffragan, Bishop Hodges-Copple assists the Rt. Rev. Michael Curry in leading the Diocese into Galilee by focusing especially on ministry in higher education, young adult ministry, ministry among Spanish-speaking communities, the ordination process for the diaconate, companion diocese relationships with Costa Rica and Botswana, ecumenical and interfaith work, and pastoral care of retired clergy and their spouses.

She and her husband, John, have three adult children. John is Director of Planning for the Triangle J Council of Governments.

Easter Egg Hunt Procedures

We hope that your children will join us for an Easter Egg Extravaganza on Easter Sunday! We will be hiding empty eggs around the grounds of St. Paul's for the children to hunt. Children can collect one egg or 100 eggs...all eggs will be turned in to our egg hunt collection area in the courtyard, where the children will receive a bag of treats in exchange for their egg or eggs. We hope these procedures will keep everyone safe and happy as they hunt for eggs. Our egg

hunt will begin around 10:20 a.m. on Easter Sunday (a few minutes after the conclusion of the 9:00 a.m. service). Egg hunt areas are: ages 0 to 3-by Kids' Club, ages 3 to 5-behind the youth wing, ages 6 to 8-on the playground, and ages 9-5th grade on the playground. Egg hunt start times will be staggered, starting with our youngest children. Please do not start hunting eggs until instructed to do so by members of the Children's Ministry Committee.

Our 9:00 a.m. Easter Sunday service will be a special "family friendly" service. There will be a child-appropriate homily, and the service will be immediately followed by the annual


Genesis (MS) and Happening (HS) – Camp Walter Johnson, Denton, NC


Adult Education Forums in April

Harvest For Hospitality, "50 For 50" Challenge

While we at St. Paul's regularly support farmworkers through gifts on Hermano Day and St. Nicholas Day, we also are participating in the Harvest for Hospitality Campaign which aims to educate parishes on the mission and services of the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry as well as to bring financial stability to that ministry. Thus, the continued presence and services of the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry depend on the financial assistance of all the other congregations in the Diocese of North Carolina and Diocese of East Carolina.




