The vestry and finance committee have been working diligently, but with so much of our budget in fixed expenses; mortgage, utilities and salaries, without an increase we will not be able to fund our programs. As the vestry and finance committee give thoughtful and careful consideration to plan how to live into the mission of St. Paul's "To know Christ and make Christ known", I hope that you will also consider your personal relationship with this **Community of St. Paul's**. How have you been fed and nurtured over the years? How can you assist us with continuing to know Christ and to make Christ known in our **Community of St. Paul's** as well as the larger community in which we live?

Courtyard Celebrates First Anniversary

The Goal: *Create a space that invites all who participate in gatherings, pass through, or view St. Paul's courtyard to savor and celebrate God in nature.*

June 12 marks the first anniversary since we dedicated our transformed courtyard. On December 20, 2010, we presented a preliminary plan to the vestry to transform the area we had come to know as "the Courtyard" since beginning to worship in our current church building in 2004. Work was largely complete in early April. This phenomenal accomplishment occurred through the grace of God, and the generous gifts of time, talent, and treasure of parishioners and our amazing partners.

Our first objective was "Create defined spaces suitable for intimate Parish gatherings (services, fellowship, receptions) and family photo occasions (baptisms, weddings, funerals)." In essence, we created an outdoor "room" that is part worship space, part classroom, part parish hall, and more.

Over the past year, we have used the courtyard for services such as the opening of Easter Vigil, Blessing of the Animals, and memorial services. It has served as a space for the youngest amongst us during children's chapel.

Tents erected in the gathering area provided an extension to the parish hall for our first-ever onsite parish picnic last fall, as well as our wildly popular annual Lobsterfest. Benches, boulders, and the retaining walls provided seating alternatives.

The community came together to make the dream of courtyard transformation a reality. Thanks to the 20 families who gave treasure, including sponsors for 9 benches and 5 artisan panels. Thanks to the 11 families who provided plant materials called for in the design, largely in the form of ground cover and perennial transplants from personal gardens. And thanks to the Men's Group who provided \$5,000 from 2010 LobsterFest proceeds.

Major thanks to the 29 parishioners who gave more than 600 hours of time and talent to plant materials, install flagstones, re-work the creek areas, lay concrete foundations for the HVAC brick screen and bell memorial, and nurture the garden during the first critical growing season.

Our project partners also provided time, talent, and treasure in the form of discounted prices to create our transformed courtyard: Garden Supply Company, Hurr & Hurr, Muro Bello Art, Fred Adams Paving Company, Case Masonry, Belson Outdoors, Creative Images, and Wake Monument.

All who participated left an imprint on the St. Paul's community that will serve generations to come. Thank you.



Endowment Fund



What is planned giving?

Usually, “planned giving” means remembering an institution such as a church or university in one’s will. That is, how can I make a difference after I am gone?

What is the St. Paul’s Endowment Fund?

This is a Fund collected through donations used to support church activities outside of the usual annual stewardship or operating budget.

Are the two related?

Most certainly! Many contributions made to the Endowment Fund are the direct result of planned giving. However, there have also been donations made to the Fund directly. Earnings from these contributions (not the contributions themselves) will be used to support such things as increased outreach and enhancement of our buildings and grounds.

As of March 31, 2012, the St. Paul’s

Endowment Fund had a balance of \$37,055. This money has been invested in established funds that are managed by the Episcopal Church Foundation. The Endowment Fund also has received promises of an additional \$412,450 in future contributions.

PLM Families Together

Some of you may have already heard of the nonprofit organization PLM Families Together (PLMFT). It is one of the organizations represented on St. Paul's Angel Tree at Christmastime.

PLMFT provides short-term housing and re-housing services for families experiencing homelessness. Their goal is to move families as quickly as possible into stable, permanent housing and then they continue to work with them for at least a year to help ensure they maintain that stability. Last year, they helped 56 families to move to permanent housing. Find out more by visiting their website at www.plmft.org.

We were invited to a story time at PLMFT designed to teach us what it means to be homeless and what we can do to help. My five-year-old son was particularly affected by the message that day, and was excited to collect items with our group to put in welcome baskets for families helped by PLMFT. After the drive, my son asked me what else we were going to do to help homeless kids. In that moment, my family's relationship with PLMFT was born.

I now lead a monthly art class at the housing facility where they have seven 3-bedroom apartments. Each month, another homeschooling mother and I create a lesson plan, gather materials, and teach an art class for both our own students and the kids ages 3-12 who are staying there. The

dynamics of the group are always changing but we always have fun whether we're doing a quiet artist study indoors or we're spread out all over the front porch painting and laughing.

At this point, I don't think my son remembers why we started this class. He just sees it as another reason to hang out with his friends (and he wants to know if we can invite all of them to come to his birthday party). I can only hope that the kids we have gotten to know at PLMFT have come away with the same sense of camaraderie and belonging that we have.

I encourage each of you to learn more about the wonderful things that PLMFT is doing and to consider how you might become a part of it too. The experience and the change of perspective it inspires makes every bit of sacrifice worthwhile.

The organization always needs welcome supplies – paper products, hygiene products, kitchen supplies, air mattresses, linens, towels, blankets, and Walmart gift cards that are given directly to families to help when they arrive with very little. 




