Rector's Letter

Dear Friends:

I had the opportunity a few weeks ago, while traveling over 800 miles throughout our diocese, to meet with a couple of clergy of our diocese who are called "diocesan missioners." These are clergy who feel a call to "do" church in new ways and respond to the invitation of our diocese to "Go to Galilee," to consider not so much how do we get people to come to church, but rather how do we bring the church to where the people are already. It includes, for these missioners, a willingness to knock on doors, particularly in underserved communities of our diocese, and seek what the needs are in these communities and find ways to shape a community of prayer, a community of faith based on responding to these needs.

You may have heard me mention in homilies that when a congregation is starting, the first thing to do is to come to know the local community and its needs. Responding to those needs is the first step towards building a congregation. What unfortunately can happen in some congregations, as they develop into a parish and build buildings, is rather than continuing to seek what the community needs the congregation begins to tell the community what the congregation needs.

Congregations that do not lose that charism of continually seeking the needs of the community are ones that I've observed in my ministry are growing and developing. St. Paul's Preschool, which next year celebrates its 25th Anniversary, is an example of folks at St. Paul's who years ago saw a need in our community and responded and created a preschool that to this day has continually been rated by the surrounding community as the best in western Wake County.

I believe that needs to be a charism we continue to support and deepen at St. Paul's. The recent energy at St. Paul's around the Refuge for Refugees ministry is just one example of this. Another example is the collaborative ministry we are presently engaged with as we join with Vonisha and her two children, Vandreya and Andre, in southeast Raleigh, building their home along with other Episcopal congregations through Habitat for Humanity. Just last month we supported the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry through Hermano Day. And plans are underway for the summer Appalachian Service Project mission trip.

As we at St. Paul's look to continue to develop and grow, I am thankful for the courageous diocesan missioners I met a few weeks ago who remind us of never forgetting that what is essential to the early beginning of a congregation needs to always be a part of its life.

May our celebration of Easter remind us of the call of the resurrected Christ to join with him in Galilee, in our community beyond the doors of the church. There we will find him.

We Hear Voices







Andy and I are marking a milestone year as we celebrate 25 years since our wedding in the chapel at St. Paul's. Neither one of us had ever put down roots so deeply before we stumbled upon St. Paul's, and I can honestly say we did not do it purposefully – our life just "happened" here. We can walk around the grounds and find the place we took preschool photos of the boys, see the buildings we helped to reconstruct, and stop at the memorial stone for our beloved Aunt Annie. Twenty five years made lots of memories for us.

Although we can be sentimental about the places in our lives, for us, it has been the people we have lived with and learned with at St. Paul's that have had the most profound effect on us. We have stood in the memorial garden for many services over the years, commending our friends and mentors to their final resting place. Their influence never ends.

Egg Hunt Instructions!

We hope that your children will join us for an Easter egg extravaganza on Easter Sunday! We will be hiding empty eggs around the grounds of St. Paul's for the children to hunt. Children can collect one egg or 100 eggs...all eggs will be turned in to our egg hunt collection area in the courtyard, where the children will receive a bag of treats in exchange for their egg or eggs. We hope these procedures will keep everyone safe and happy as they hunt for eggs. Our egg hunt will begin around 10:30 a.m. on Easter Sunday (a few minutes after the conclusion of the 9:00 a.m. service). Egg hunt areas are: ages 0 to 3 – by kids' club; ages 3 to 5 – behind the youth wing; ages 6 to 8 – on the playground; and ages 9-5th grade – on the playground. Egg hunt start times will be staggered, starting with our youngest children. Please do not start hunting eggs until instructed to do so by members of the Children's Ministry Committee.




Children's Stewardship Update: \$1600 to go for Note in the Pocket!






