## Letter From The Rector

Dear Friends:

### Go speak! Sharing our Faith.

Bishop Curry invited us at our recent diocesan convention to "Go deep! Go speak! Go do!" Last month I shared some ways we may respond to Bishop Curry's invitation as a parish to go deep during this season of Lent. This month, as we enter the Easter season, I'd like to share with you a way we will practice our ability to "Go speak!"

The diocese has invited all congregations to participate in "Go speak! Sharing our Faith." How does it work? It was described in the recent edition of the diocesan publication of *The Disciple* as follows:

On May 15, small groups of 8-10 Episcopalians – as many groups as we can possibly organize, with some meeting during the day and some in the evening - will gather in homes or other informal settings across the diocese. Under the direction of a trained moderator, participants will practice sharing personal stories in matters of faith with people we know, and some we don't, but with whom we share a common worship life. The process for the event is designed to create a comfortable situation in which everyone present discovers they have a story of faith to tell. Even more importantly, participants will experience the power of deep listening. This will not be an evening of discussion, debate, or even dialogue. While there will be an element of fellowship because the sharing takes place over a meal, this is not primarily a social event. It is a chance to practice listening and speaking about those things nearest to our hearts.

This experience of "Shared Faith Stories" comes to us from the Diocese of Texas where three years ago Episcopalians gathered in 250 homes throughout the diocese with over 1300 participants simply telling their faith stories. We all have stories to tell.

Over the weeks ahead here at St. Paul's we will be organizing for these gatherings of parishioners. You'll be hearing more about this and I look forward to the stories we will share with one another. If you would like to help in the coordination of these gatherings please contact me at



The Jewish Seder (SAY-dur) is the Passover meal celebrated by our Jewish brothers and sisters commemorating their deliverance from slavery in Egypt. It is a meal celebrated in Jewish homes according to a ritual followed for centuries. It is believed that the meal that Jesus was celebrating at the Last Supper was a Passover meal. Thus the ritual and meaning of that meal is significant for the Christian understanding of the Eucharist. At St. Paul's we will celebrate a Passover meal, a Seder, as a means of learning about the Eucharist.

## Memorial Garden Expansion Update

The expansion of our garden is on! The Town of Cary has approved our project; the vestry has given the go-ahead to get started; the contracts have been signed with the construction company, ValleyCrest, and the niche provider, Homecoming, Inc.; and the new markers for our garden and the remembrance area have been ordered from Wake Monument. Construction is scheduled to begin the first part of April. The work is expected to be completed in eight weeks. All the moving parts have been set in motion and it will be exciting to watch our vision become a reality!

The support from our parish has been incredible. Parishioners have made prepayments on niches, in-ground plots, sponsored commemorative items, and have made donations. Thank you to each and everyone who has done so. It is largely through prepayments that our project is being funded.

While we have made great strides, we are still pursuing our fundraising target. If you have interest in making a prepayment or donating to the project, please consider finalizing your commitment within the next several weeks. Thank you!

Members of the committee will continue to be available at the Memorial Garden table in the back of the church immediately following the 9 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. services. 

## Easter Egg Hunt Procedures

We hope that your children will join us for an Easter Egg Extravaganza on Easter Sunday! We will be hiding empty eggs around the grounds of St. Paul's for the children to hunt. Children can collect one egg or 100 eggs...all eggs will be turned in to our egg hunt collection area in the courtyard, where the children will receive a bag of treats in exchange for their egg or eggs. We hope these procedures will keep everyone safe and happy as they hunt for eggs. Our egg hunt will begin around 10:20 a.m. on

Easter Sunday (a few minutes after the conclusion of the 9:00 a.m. service). Egg hunt areas are: ages 0 to 3-by Kids' Club, ages 3 to 5-behind the Youth Wing, ages 6 to 8-on the playground, and ages 9-5<sup>th</sup> grade on the playground. ## Easter Candy



We are going to race around Cary looking for clues in the strangest of places. The youth will be divided up into teams and will


text pictures of their progress along the way. Come test your navigational skills and see if you can help your team be the first to follow all the clues to the finish. It's a whacky night!

## Donations Needed to Help Rescue Girls from Poverty in Honduras

Our Little Roses (OLR) girls who have been rescued from the most impoverished situations now receive healthy advantages in a loving home. This includes a good education, balanced diet, medical and mental health care, and opportunities to learn how to succeed. OLR continuously receives new girls who have no one to care for them and who will also realize a life of hope. OLR currently provides for approximately 80 girls. The sense of family at Our Little Roses sustains all the girls, all of whom are active in church. OLR is located in San Pedro Sula, Honduras and has its roots in the Episcopal church. Many are members of the choir, youth fellowship leaders, and acolytes.

This year St. Paul's will be receiving items for donation April 2-20. There will be a box marked OLR will be in the foyer. The girls are 2 - 22 years old.

Because the girls have been abused and developing positive self-esteem is a major function of the school, it is requested that all donations be new. Donating any of the following items would be a wonderful way for you to participate in supporting the girls at OLR: Twin bed size sheets, towels, clothing (remember the climate is very warm), undergarments, socks, hair ribbons, barrettes, scrunchies, makeup, and books of all kinds in Spanish and English.
