



Holidays often bring families together. With the Advent and Christmas Seasons upon us I would like to invite you to gather together with the St. Paul's parish family. Every Sunday, over the weeks ahead, has something special about it. This is a wonderful time of the year to invite friends or perhaps coworkers to join us all at St. Paul's. All are welcome.

November 28 Advent I

Between the 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. service gather together for our intergenerational event bringing together children and adults.

December 5 Advent II

You don't want to miss a visit we await each year from St. Nicholas. At both 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. services we will have an opportunity to give St. Nicholas gifts for him to bring to children. And you don't want to miss that special golden chocolate coin St. Nicholas gives to all he meets that day.



December 12 Advent III

Join with the children at the 9:00 a.m. service for the annual Christmas Pageant. This is a celebration you do not want to miss. Besides the shepherds and kings who visited Jesus at his birth, you will also see some surprise visitors never mentioned in the Bible.

December 19 Advent IV

Join us as we celebrate the final Sunday of Advent and prepare for the festive celebration of Christmas.

7:00 p.m. - Celebration of the Eucharist filled with wonderful Christmas carols.

Warden's Corner



With the end of 2010 quickly approaching, my term as your Senior Warden is also coming to an end. Three other vestry members, Jean Huey, Chuck Hubbard, and Ann Lockhart, are also reaching the ends of their three-year terms and will rotate off the vestry. Please be sure to thank them for their service.

It is now time to elect new vestry members and your help is needed – 1) to nominate people you think would be good to have in leadership positions at St. Paul's and 2) to prayerfully consider if you would be willing to serve. A nominating committee is currently talking to parishioners about what the goals and issues might be for the next year and gathering lists of people eligible to serve. According to church policies, a candidate has to be an "enrolled, confirmed, adult communicant in good standing." This means someone – maybe you - who is baptized, is listed on the church roll, is over 15 years of age, and has received communion at least three times in the previous year. She or he must also have been faithful in corporate worship, and in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God. What a mouthful, but there are over 460 people at St. Paul's who meet these criteria!

After a slate of candidates is put together (ideally with twice the number of candidates as the four open positions), elections are held for three-year terms at the annual meeting. For 2011, the annual meeting will be held on January 9. The time commitment involved is modest and includes a vestry meeting each month (2-3 hours), a local retreat, and perhaps an additional budget meeting in December. There will also be voluntary assignments to connect with various ministries and perform sub-committee work as needed. Overall, the time involved may be less than that you already devote to outside activities like coaching youth sports, singing in choirs, and volunteering in the school system.


The most important part of serving on the vestry is a passion and care for the future of St. Paul's. You will make a difference, and in my experience, serving on a vestry is the very best way to understand how the church is organized and operates. It is also a wonderful way to meet great people serving a good cause and to grow in your own understanding of what a church can mean.




Bishops' Ball: Dec. 10-12, Grades 6-12

St. Nicholas Day is almost here! Dec 5


St. Nicholas will “visit” both our 9:00 and our 11:15 a.m. services on December 5th. He will collect gifts provided by the St. Paul’s community for 457 children (from more than 157 families) who need a helping hand this year. His annual visit is a wonderful opportunity to be a part of the giving spirit of Christmas.

The children’s names are gathered from six area ministries that support families and children in need: CommWell Health, which serves migrant and seasonal farm workers in the Dunn/Newton Grove area, the Thompson Child and Family Focus – an Episcopal orphanage/family ministry located in Charlotte, the Episcopal Housing Ministry, located in Raleigh, The Healing Place of Raleigh, the Caring Place in Cary, and PLM Families Together - serving Wake County. For more

information about each of these ministries, check out the St. Nicholas’ Ministry (under Outreach) on the St. Paul’s website.

The gifts will be delivered to the participating agencies on the afternoon of St. Nicholas’ Sunday. If you can’t attend service on December 5, please drop off your gifts at St. Paul’s BEFORE that date.

Help us share the love of Christ by providing gifts for these children who endure many hardships every day. Your generosity in support of this ministry shows these children that they are loved in a very special way, by Christ and by his community here at St. Paul’s. We are looking forward to the day when the faces of our children light up with the love of Christ, given and received.



Outreach Notes

FOOD DRIVE: Thank you St. Paul’s for your generous response to the food drive. We took just over 650 pounds of food to Urban Ministries, the largest drive we’ve ever had except for the one in conjunction with the choir festival last year, when we took in 1000 pounds of food. There are families in Wake County who are eating better because of your generosity!

CHRISTMAS OFFERING: The loose offering from the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services will be divided between two programs. The first, a local program, is the Interfaith Food Shuttle, which picks up food from grocery stores and other retail outlets and delivers it to food pantries and homeless shelters.

This is often food that would be thrown away as it reaches expiration dates, and that can be put to use by efficient delivery to places that can make immediate use of it. The second is an international program, KIVA, which is a microlending organization in which the donors can decide which programs their contributions should support. The Youth Group at St. Paul’s supports this program with funds raised from their KIVA Carnival.
