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Letter From The Rector

The Rev. George Adamik

Dear Friends:

At the Diocese of North Carolina's recent annual diocesan convention, Bishop Curry presented us with a threefold challenge. Go deep! Go Speak! Go do! I'd like to share some reflections in this article on that first challenge of "Go deep!"

When I hear God moving in the midst of people's lives in scripture, particularly those touched by the presence of Jesus, I never hear them being called to become "members," but rather "disciples." It seems to me that somewhere along the line, we the followers of Jesus have become more focused on creating members than creating disciples. Membership has taken the place of discipleship.

As mainline religion experiences a time of decreasing membership, I wonder if it is God waking us up to our real call of discipleship. I think Bishop Curry's challenge to our diocese is a challenge to that discipleship. And the first step for us is to "Go deep!" What does that mean?

We have within our Episcopal tradition so much depth. And so often we are just scratching the surface. I'd like to invite you this Lent to an intentional time of getting below the surface and exploring this depth.

During the Lenten season there will be some wonderful offerings. On the Sundays of Lent during the Adult Education hour The Rev. J Carr Holland will offer a series entitled "The Four Gospels: Four Portraits - One Person."

We will also be offering a 6-session series, A History of Christianity. This study based on the book *A History of Christianity* by the acclaimed Anglican author Diarmaid MacCulloch will consist of a video presentation followed by discussion. Joe Ryan and The Rev. George Adamik will be facilitating. This series will be presented in the chapel on the Wednesday evenings of Lent, March 12, 19, 26, April 2, 9, and 16 at 7:00 p.m. It will also be offered on those same Wednesday mornings at 10:15 a.m.

I would also like to invite you to consider setting aside some daily time for prayer using the daily office of the Book of Common Prayer. Not sure what that is? Well go to the parish website at www.stpaulscary.org and select the link on the left called "Daily Office." There you will be led to an explanation of the daily office with page references to the Book of Common Prayer and readings from the daily office read by St. Paul's parishioners.

Consider also participating in all the services of Holy Week. These are liturgies like no others. Their depth is a spiritual gift.

Lent was originally a season in the early church of final preparation for those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. It was also a time of renewing baptismal promises for those already baptized. May this season of Lent be a time of reflection, of renewal, and going deep into the mystery of God's movement in your life.

As you have probably heard, Bishop Curry has challenged parishes to "Go Deep! Go Speak! Go Do!" There are many opportunities for St. Paul's to heed his challenge during the month of March. Bishop Curry talked about the needs in the migrant worker community and St. Paul's will once again this year collect clothing and basic items to be provided to the migrant workers via the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry. During the recent Adult Education Series on Social Justice, we heard about hunger in our area and we will have the opportunity to help with this need by packing basic bags of food for Urban Ministries. The Rex Blood Mobile will be at St. Paul's for each of us to donate blood to help save a life. Kairos has multiple opportunities where

you can participate, either within the prison or outside by providing support to the team that will be at the NC Correctional Institute for Women. Please review the opportunities for you to go deep, go speak, and go do in more detail found in this newsletter and determine where you can make a difference.

The activities for which you can make a difference are endless in the future months, so look for them in the newsletter, the St. Paul's website, or the weekly announcements.

Inquirer’s Class



The Jewish Seder (SAY-dur) is the Passover meal celebrated by our Jewish brothers and sisters commemorating their deliverance from slavery in Egypt. It is a meal celebrated in Jewish homes according to a ritual followed for centuries. It is believed that the meal that Jesus was celebrating at the Last Supper was a Passover meal. Thus the ritual and meaning of that meal is significant for the Christian understanding of the Eucharist. At St. Paul’s we will celebrate a Passover meal, a Seder, as a means of learning about the Eucharist.






One Church, One Book

The Four Gospels: Four Portraits - One Person


Sundays March 2, 9, 16, 23, & 30

Helping Homeless Families Reach Independence

17th Annual “Hermano Day” (Farmworker Day) - Sunday, March 9



This time of year, farmworkers from Mexico journey to North Carolina to work on farms located just an hour from Cary. The men live in remote and isolated labor camps with only the barest of necessities. The Episcopal Farmworker Ministry in Newton Grove, under the direction of Father Tony Rojas, serves men in 49 labor camps by providing them with a Sacramental Ministry, clothing, bedding, food, and medicine. St. Paul’s helps by donating work clothes and bedding and by offering financial support. On Sunday, March 9, a representative from the Episcopal Farmworker Ministry will be here to tell us about the work being done to help our farmworker brothers in Christ. Please bring your donations to church that day.

The items most urgently needed are:

- ◆ Men’s work pants (sizes 24, 26, 28, 30, 32)

- ◆ Men’s socks and athletic shoes
- ◆ Men’s long sleeved shirts (smaller sizes)
- ◆ Men’s T-shirts (smaller sizes)
- ◆ Men’s underwear (small or medium)
- ◆ Sheets (twins are best)
- ◆ Towels, light blankets, pillows
- ◆ Corn meal (MASECA)
- ◆ Dried beans and rice

ITEMS CAN BE NEW OR USED. An excellent alternative is to make a monetary donation earmarked for either a Welcome Kit or a Shower Kit. Please use the memo part of your check for this. A Welcome Kit (\$75.00) provides a farmworker with a Shower Kit plus 3 pairs of used work pants, 3 shirts, a towel, a blanket, sheets and a pillow. A Shower Kit (\$25.00) will provide a farmworker with a kit containing shampoo, soap, toothpaste, deodorant, razors, a washcloth, Bengay, Benadryl, and Ibuprofen.

Little Red Wagon Food Collection

The Little Red Wagon stands waiting every week for food to take to hungry folks in Wake County. The food goes to the Urban Ministries food pantry, which provides food for up to 40 families a day, five days a week.

We have made an amazing jump in the amount of food we are providing, since the Little Red Wagon took up residence in the lobby of St. Paul’s. Before the middle of September, when the Wagon came to St. Paul’s, we had provided just over 1000 pounds of food during 2013. After the Wagon came to stay, we provided almost 2400 more pounds of food by the end of the year, for a total of 3380 pounds of food during 2013. And already in six weeks of 2014 we have sent over 1200 pounds of food (including the EYC Souper Bowl

Collection of 130.6 pounds from the St. Paul’s neighborhood)

Our increased contribution has been noted and appreciated at Urban Ministries. I hope to provide an article for the Urban Ministries newsletter sometime this year, to tell the rest of the community about our increased outreach. And in the meantime, thank you to all the contributors of food. All non-perishable food is welcome, whether it’s cans of tomatoes or boxes of granola bars, it all gets handed out as soon as it comes in. And we’re glad to have your left over grocery bags, too, to pack the food that is distributed from Urban Ministries. Keep up the good work!
