Staff Transitions

Having said farewell to two outstanding staff members, Rev. Dr. Sally Harbold, Associate Rector, and Chris Lewis, Financial Manager, the last few weeks have been a time of discernment as we look to the future.

A new position of part time Parish Administrator has been created with the primary responsibilities of Human Resources and Finance. I have invited Christine Ingram to take on this new position and she has graciously accepted. While we know of Christine's tremendous leadership of St. Paul's Children's Ministry, I also knew of her Human Resource background. Christine earned a Bachelors of Arts in Industrial Relations from UNC Chapel Hill, and has 9 years of experience in HR, 4 of those in HR Management with InterContinental Hotels Raleigh Reservation Center and 2 years of Corporate HR and Management Training Consulting with InterContinental Hotels Headquarters in Atlanta, GA. Christine earned her PHR (Professional in Human Resources Certification) in 1999 and her SPHR (Senior Professional in Human Resources Certification) in 2002.

Christine will also continue her leadership as the Director of Children's Ministry, thereby dividing her time between the two roles of Parish Administrator and Director of Children's Ministries. Christine will be assisted in these roles by two people: a Children's Ministry Assistant (12 hours a week) and a Financial Assistant (15 hours a week). I am excited to say that Christa Magee has been invited to serve as the Children's Ministry Assistant and she has accepted the position. Christa has served on Children's Ministries Committee for 3 years, served as Assistant Director for VBS for 2 years, Assistant Director for the Christmas Pageant for 2 years and has helped in many other volunteer assignments for Children's Ministries. The Financial Assistant position will be filled as soon as possible through a posting and interview process.

I am personally very excited about our life and ministry at St. Paul's as we transition to a new beginning. I know that Christine will provide important leadership in her new role and that Christa will provide continued support and energy in our Children's Ministry. Please join with me in congratulating both of them.

Archbishop of Canterbury

As I mentioned in last month's article March 19 was the installation of the 266th Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis, and March 21 was the installation of the 105th Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby. It is a rare historical moment. This month I would like to offer a couple reflections on the new Archbishop of Canterbury.

Before being ordained a priest in 1992, Justin Welby had an interesting

career in the oil industry eventually becoming group treasurer of a large British exploration and production company. He focused mainly on West African and North Sea projects. I refer you to <http://www.archbishopofcanterbury.org/pages/about-justin-welby.html> for more detailed information about his family, experience and educational background, which is quite interesting.

In my reading about the new archbishop what struck me was the emphasis in his ministry of social justice. While he refers to many influences that shaped his thinking on social justice, the biggest influence he refers to is the encyclical "Rerum Novarum" written by Pope Leo XIII in 1891 on the topic of Capital and Labor. In this encyclical Pope Leo XIII emphasized the concept of rights and duties of workers and employers, emphasizing workers have rights and also have duties to their employers; likewise employers have rights and also have duties to their workers. Having spent time studying that powerful encyclical while I was in seminary, and being well aware of its challenging message to the world of that time and still to ours as well, I found it one of the most interesting confluences of theology and thought between the new Bishop of Rome, Pope Francis, and our Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby. I'll be very interested in seeing where this leads in the years ahead.

I invite your prayers for Archbishop Welby as he begins a challenging ministry not only looking inward at our wondrous and at times contentious Anglican Communion, but also calling us outward to issues of justice in the world around us all.



drama where music plays a key role in telling this great story. The children will present this work during the 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. worship services.


The Musical Cabaret

Volunteers Needed: Facilities Maintenance - Buildings & Grounds


The Facilities Management Steering Committee and the Building and Grounds Committees are both looking for volunteers.

If you have handyman skills and are willing to be “on call” for minor repair and maintenance efforts around the church, we need you to volunteer to join the Building and Grounds Committee. This committee will do “hands on” work around the church, including things like changing light bulbs, touch up painting, minor repairs (e.g., changing a float in a toilet), helping with wasps, ants, or other pests, etc. We need lots of you handymen out there to volunteer to be on a list of people that we can contact about these repairs, but we also need someone to chair this important committee. So if you like building or fixing things, give Larry Cupitt or the church office a call and sign up.

If you have an interest or expertise in life cycle / risk evaluation, construction, computer hardware / networks, HVAC systems, telephone or security systems, etc., then we need you to help with the Facilities Management Steering Committee. This committee has been tasked by the vestry with developing a 5-year plan for the facility and for developing and maintaining an inventory of the church’s fixed assets. This committee’s role is also to advise the vestry on priorities for maintaining and improving the St. Paul’s buildings and infrastructure.
