Nita Byrd Ordained a Priest

Congratulations to The Rev. Nita Byrd, ordained a priest on October 14 at historic St. Augustine's Chapel in Raleigh, NC. The chapel was built many years ago by students of St. Augustine's College under the direction and guidance of The Rev. Henry Delany, an 1885 graduate of St. Augustine's who in 1918 was ordained Bishop Suffragan for North Carolina. Bishop Delany was the first African-American bishop in the Episcopal Church. Nita was the first woman ordained in the chapel with the last ordination occurring in the chapel 80 years ago. For those of you new to St. Paul's, Nita has been a parishioner of St. Paul's for the last 13 years and we are proud to have been her sponsoring parish for ordination to the priesthood.

Warden's Corner



As we approach the beginning of 2014, our St. Paul's community is on the brink of an exciting new chapter. 2013 was a time of tremendous transition at St. Paul's. Indeed, we are still in the midst of many of those changes, but change brings opportunity. Opportunity to strengthen and grow the areas we as a parish determined as our priorities in the 2012 Visioning Process. Over the next several months the vestry will be developing the budget for 2014. What will our staff look like? How will we supplement program support with operating dollars? How can we reach out and change our community and the world?

We need the support of each and every member of our community to fulfill this mission.

As explained in our Stewardship Campaign, approximately 95% of our

2013 Operating Budget was applied to non-discretionary spending. This left the vestry with approximately \$48K to support programs (Youth, Music, Children, Outreach) and run the office. This was accomplished by the support of 330 pledging families (only \$70K comes from plate offerings.)

Our community is changing lives every day, in ways big and small. I hope you have had the opportunity to read the stories parishioners have shared these past few weeks about how St. Paul's has touched their lives and the lives of their families. Can you imagine what wonderful things we can accomplish when everyone participates?

Where Have All the Lobsters Gone?



EVERYWHERE!! Cary, Apex, Morrisville, Raleigh, Chapel Hill, Durham, Garner, Clayton, Holly Springs, Willow Spring, Knightdale, Fuquay, Sanford, Snow Camp, New Hill, Louisburg, Wake Forest, Youngsville, Wendell, Selma, Pittsboro, Efland, Greensboro, Randleman, Winston Salem, Wilmington..... (yes, these are purchases from our e-mail and address lists).

MORE THAN A TON (2,400 lbs. or 1,600 each) of Lobsters, ONE AND A THIRD FOOTBALL FIELDS of Lobsta Rolls (800 of them) laid end to end(that's more yardage than some of our football teams can manage.) And we had about 100 happy but tired volunteers at the end of the day. That adds up to about 2,400 "Happy (lobster / lobster roll) Meal Eaters," compared to about 1,650 last year. How did that happen?

First, our on-line ordering system continues to evolve (making it easier for customers to purchase), our e-mail list grows, our publicity improves, but this year more than ever it appears as though parishioners made the effort to pass out business cards, put up flyers in their office, and to tell friends about Lobster Fest. The increase in the number of Lobster Parties hosted by both parishioners and guests (Party Pack delivery increased as well as customer pick-ups) is significant. Finally, the good PR from mid-week articles in the Cary News and News & Observer helped us

over the top (biggest sales day ever that Wednesday and helped lead to the largest walk-up crowd on Saturday we have witnessed – almost overwhelming at times!).

The above efforts by our "All-Volunteer Army, St. Paul's Team" (AVAST) helped us "gross" more than \$42,000, and "net" (profits) of about \$17,000. Some of those profits will be used for St. Paul's needs (such as bringing up to speed St. Paul's IT needs, assisting 2014 Youth participation in ASP, and supporting Stop Hunger Now, Memorial Garden Expansion, other St. Paul's needs and various Outreach opportunities). The "numbers" are always interesting, a means of record-keeping, and a way of showing visible outcome of time and love expended by many. The real Results of Lobster Fest lie in the pride and feeling of accomplishment of the many St. Paul's folks that participated, all the way from picking up and putting down a business card and putting up a poster; to hours spent in the kitchen, parish hall, outside cooking, welcoming and taking care of guests; driving / picking up / delivering; donating of goods and money; forwarding e-mails and FaceBook messages; purchasing lobsters and inviting friends over; and invaluable help in the planning. THANK YOU ALL! And if you find yourself in more than one category above, even more THANK YOU's!


Clergy Led Children's Chapel

St. Nicholas will make his annual visit on December 8th this year. His annual visit is a wonderful opportunity to be a part of the giving spirit of Christmas.

The Advent tree will be up on November 17th, the Sunday before Thanksgiving, and will be loaded with tags identifying needy children in our community.

We are gathering the names for our list from local area ministries that support families and children in need:

CommWell Health supports seasonal farmworkers; **Thompson Child and Family Focus Ministry** is an Episcopal-sponsored program providing comprehensive education, treatment, and care for children in need; the **Episcopal Housing Ministry** provides affordable housing in our community; **The Healing Place** is a non-profit recovery and rehabilitation facility for homeless people with alcohol and drug dependency in Raleigh; the **Carying Place** teaches homeless, working families with children life skills for independent living while providing short-term housing and support; and **PLM Families Together** is an ecumenical organization that helps homeless families with housing and learning the skills needed to remain housed.

You are invited to take one or more tags from the tree and purchase a gift for each child. Since some parishioners have asked for tags of multiple children in the same family, we will have some of the tags grouped together by family:

they will be held by the St. Nicholas figure next to the tree.

Bring your gifts to a service on December 8th. St. Nicholas will visit both our 9:00 a.m. service and our 11:15 a.m. service on that day to gather the gifts and then deliver them to the children. It is an exciting day at St. Paul's, and we hope you will be a part of the event.

The gifts will be delivered to the participating agencies on the afternoon of St. Nicholas Sunday. If you cannot attend service on December 8, please drop off your gifts before that date. Gifts dropped off after noon on December 8th will not get to the child. (They will not go to waste, however: they will be saved and used next year as a gift for children whose tags are not returned.)



News from St. Paul's Giving Board

St. Paul's Giving Board is tasked with being a resource to the parish on matters of fundraising and giving. We'll use this space to publicize emerging ideas about fundraising and stewardship and to provide information about innovative ways of donating to St. Paul's.

Last month we discussed the extension of the IRA Charitable Rollover and the advantages of a Donor Advised Trust. This month we want to make potential donors aware that there are a number of other ways of giving that may suit them better than "ordinary" cash contributions. For example, the following may provide substantial tax benefits and added convenience to donors:

- * Typically, donations of stock are tax deductible and the donor is exempt from taxes on the stock's capital gains;

- * Bequests (e.g., naming St. Paul's will) permit donors to leave a portion of their estate after it is no longer of use to them;

- * Charitable Gift Annuities can provide the donor with an immediate tax deduction and steady income stream, while also benefiting a designated charity.

Your board can steer you to some of these alternatives so that you may discuss further with financial planners and/or tax accountants and attorneys.


The St. Paul's Endowment Fund
