Letter From The Rector

The Rev. George Adamik

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Dear Friends:

A few weeks ago I had the opportunity to join with others from St. Paul's to learn about the most recent Appalachian Service Project mission trip to Mitchell County, North Carolina. I have never felt more proud of our youth than I did that evening. Let me tell you why.

A couple years ago Bishop Curry called our diocese to a Galilean Initiative. It is based on the resurrection story where it is announced to those who come to the tomb, seeking the body of Jesus, that "he is not here, he has been raised, he has gone ahead of you to Galilee, there you will find him." This story is reminding us that the resurrected Jesus, the fullness of the Christ, has gone ahead of us. We are called to go and find him and join with him in ministry. And where is he? Where is the resurrected Christ?

My spiritual journey, as long as I can remember, has taught me that the Christ is present among the poor, the oppressed, the homeless, those suffering from injustice and violence. The Christ is present among those in need of healing and wholeness. And it seems to me that is where the early followers of Christ found him because that was Galilee.

Our ASP youth and adult volunteers went to Galilee this past summer. It was the Galilee of Mitchell County, North Carolina. And what they experienced there was not just the physical activity of improving the living conditions of a family by the use of tools, but it was entering into relationship with those who lived in that house. They experienced the hospitality of a family who welcomed them to their home.

At the gathering I attended we saw a presentation through pictures of the trip put together by Zach Swann. A few youth, Josh McClenney, Anna Taranto and Izzie Hirschey shared their experience of the ASP trip. Each and every one of them expressed their relationship with the people whose home they were privileged to work in and around. It wasn't just about the work and the tools, but it was how much the people they met meant to them. Izzie expressed how she had such a difficult time leaving and saying good bye.

I have always believed that all ministry is relational. During the recent visioning process when I heard the parish expressing loud and clear the desire for "hands on outreach" I was encouraged beyond belief. Hands on outreach for me means not just the doing of something for somebody, but also entering into relationship with that person. That's Galilee. And Christ is present where that is happening.

Our youth get that. And I am thankful and proud of their example and leadership.

Children's, Youth, and Music Ministries.


This month I would like to highlight two groups for special thanks:


Women's Study Group




LOBSTER FEST is almost here

Memorial Garden Expansion Project

The Memorial Garden Committee presented an informational session detailing the memorial garden expansion project Wednesday evening, August 22nd. Seventy people attended and heard about the plans for the existing memorial garden and the proposed columbarium, the surrounding area; the costs of the plan, and the projected timeline for the completion of the project (Summer 2014). The session included time to answer any questions generated from the presentation. The Memorial Garden Committee received excellent feedback from those attending. Currently, our design company, Stewart, Inc., is working on the construction design and on obtaining the Town of

Cary's approval of the design through the town's submission process, which may take up to two months. The Memorial Garden Committee plans to present a town-approved design, along with estimated costs to the entire parish on November 17th.



area and we will be picking them up every week. We will be delivering the backpacks to the Durham VA around Veterans Day!




