Rector's Letter

Dear Friends,

As we celebrate the 60th Anniversary of St. Paul's this year, the great feast of Pentecost, which falls on Sunday, May 20, offers us a time to reflect upon the birth of the church over 2,000 years ago. What an experience that must have been. These followers of Christ whose initial response to the resurrection was one of fear, and a desire to hide, were courageously moved by the Holy Spirit to go forth into the world.

The story of Pentecost is about a group of followers who went forth to tell of this risen Christ and incredibly were understood by all in the language of the hearers. Let me say that again. The telling of the story of the risen Christ was understood by all in the language of the hearers. What a model for us to remember today.

As St. Paul's remembers our 60 years of ministry, we also look to the future as we continue "Welcoming in Christ." As we move forward as a growing community of faith, we too will need to be understood in the language of those who hear us. And language is not just about knowing the words of the language of another country, but also understanding the culture, the way of thinking, the understanding of a people. St. Paul was a master of this. He was able to be understood by Jew and Gentile.

While the church has been able to speak in a language familiar to "The Greatest Generation" and "Baby Boomers," the church today needs to speak the language of "Gen X" and "Millennials" as well. May we at St. Paul's, like those earlier followers of Christ, be open to the moving of the Holy Spirit, and speak a language that all can understand.

Each month we will offer a devotional reflection, available on our website, on a particular area of ministry at St. Paul's. During this month of May we want to focus upon music and the arts as expressions of faith, as language that can speak to our senses beyond words. We are surrounded by expressions of art in the beautiful altar frontals and vestments designed and crafted by parishioners. We see the beauty of artistic expression by our Preschool and Sunday School children in the education building, and our youth in the youth wing. We see the ultimate expression of art in the beauty of liturgy carefully prepared and planned by our clergy, music minister, and altar guild.

Music has been called the universal language that speaks to the depths of our hearts. We are blessed at St. Paul's with a wonderful music ministry of leaders, musicians, and choirs, made up of parishioners of all ages across diverse backgrounds and gifts. We are invited each Sunday to express our faith through liturgy and music.

As this month's monthly devotional states: "As we anticipate and experience the drama of Pentecost and the 60th birthday of St. Paul's Church, let us offer prayers of hope and thanksgiving on behalf of God's welcoming

The Power of Intentional, Accountable Relationships

On Thursday, April 19, hundreds gathered at Christ the King Lutheran Church on Walnut Street for the first Internal Assembly of the Wake County Sponsors. We heard about the difficulties faced by hardworking families due to the lack of reliable public transportation in Cary and about flooding in Southeast Raleigh. We heard about the persistent bigotry, neglect, and abuse experienced by immigrants and minorities of all kinds. We heard about the meaningful relationships being forged by people from every language, people, tribe, and nation in Wake County.

The call to action at the end of the assembly was simple: will you commit to building the relationships necessary for us to change this world for the better?

The most revolutionary tool of non-partisan, broad-based community organizing is the individual meeting – the relationships built, over time, among the people and institutions they represent.

The point of these individual meetings is not to come in with an agenda or a sales pitch; rather, the point is to share what drives you – and in turn, to hear what drives the other – so that we can identify our common ground. By building these relationships, we develop the social fabric necessary to act consistently, persistently, and powerfully over time.

There is much we can achieve together – much we have the power to change – if we choose to act in solidarity with one another. As people of faith, however, we are often afraid of "power." Our most common experience with it, after all, is that of its misuse and abuse by people we trust. Yet power, at its core, is simply the ability to do something, anything. By itself, it is neither good nor bad. The kind of power that Wake County Sponsors hopes to build, therefore, is power with others, relational power – not power over others, the kind of power that abuses and oppresses. It is this kind of power that filled the early Christian community as they witnessed to the hope that was in them. It is this kind of power that got Paul and Silas accused of "turning the world upside down" (Acts 17:6).

Friends, you are invited to take part in this effort. For some, it seems painfully slow, for others, anxieties of all kinds may arise: what if we don't find common ground? How could we ever come to consensus among such a diverse group? I invite you, therefore, simply to come and see: there will be training sessions throughout the coming months that will equip leaders in our congregation to do this work, including a three-day training in Durham (May 17-19) and various evening courses through the IAF University for Public Life. If you are interested, please reach out to me or to Katie Bricio (katiebricio13@gmail.com). I look forward to hearing from you.

Warden's Corner

I want to thank Olivia Delahaye, Junior Warden, for her Warden's Corner article in the April newsletter. It was so thoughtfully and carefully written that I feel my May newsletter submission is almost inadequate!

I want to express again how hard the Capital Campaign Committee is working with our consultants Moss & Ross, and the architectural firm LS3P Associates to develop an extraordinary and exciting campaign and design(s) for the campus. We are now in the so-called "quiet" phase of the campaign. We plan on continuing to work on the campaign, making visits to parishioners, and developing building plans and other campaign priorities over the next five months. Our goal is to tie the campaign kick-off in with the 60th celebration of the parish on September 16th, 2018. Hence, the name of the capital campaign is "Welcoming in Christ – The Anniversary Campaign." If you have questions about the campaign, how to contribute your time, talents, treasure, how to help make visits, and more, please reach out to Rick Bradley (vestry member) and/or Frank Laney, who are doing a splendid job coordinating this campaign. I want the vestry to lead this campaign by example, and prayerfully hope for 100% participation by the vestry. Pledging for the capital campaign will be done in 2018. Capital Campaign pledge payments are typically fulfilled over the next three years: in this case, 2019-2021.

On to another subject. What is Pentecost? Pentecost is the annual Christian festival commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after his ascension from earth to heaven on Ascension Day. Also known as Whitsunday, it always falls on the

seventh Sunday after Easter. This year that will be Sunday, May 20th. This is a time for St. Paul's to focus upon music and the arts as expressions of faith.

A Pentecost Reflection: Jerusalem – important international cross-roads, a busy city in the ancient world. Jerusalem – where Jesus faced persecution, betrayal, trial, brutal crucifixion, and death. Jerusalem where the garden tomb was opened on Easter morning and women were the first to encounter and announce the risen Christ. The bewildered disciples begin to learn again that they will receive power and forgiveness through the Holy Spirit and bear witness locally, regionally, and globally to God's love in Christ. Christ ascends into heaven. And on the day of Pentecost, a harvest festival set fifty days after Passover, the church is born. The disciples are gifted by the Holy Spirit, and they share eloquently with the crowds about the great things God has done. They speak in every language, and so they are heard and understood by citizens from across the known world. Yes, it is bizarre and powerful. Their reaction is understandable: "Friends, what are we to do?" And the hearers are instructed to repent and be baptized, and are welcomed into the church."

Finally – I think spring is right around the corner. It must be. With spring comes beach trips for the Men's and Women's groups, ASP Spring Chore Day (May 12), Vacation Bible School (VBS) June 18-22, and the annual ASP trip June 24-30 to Tennessee. Safe travels to all concerned.







Women's Study Group




ASP Spring Chore Day




